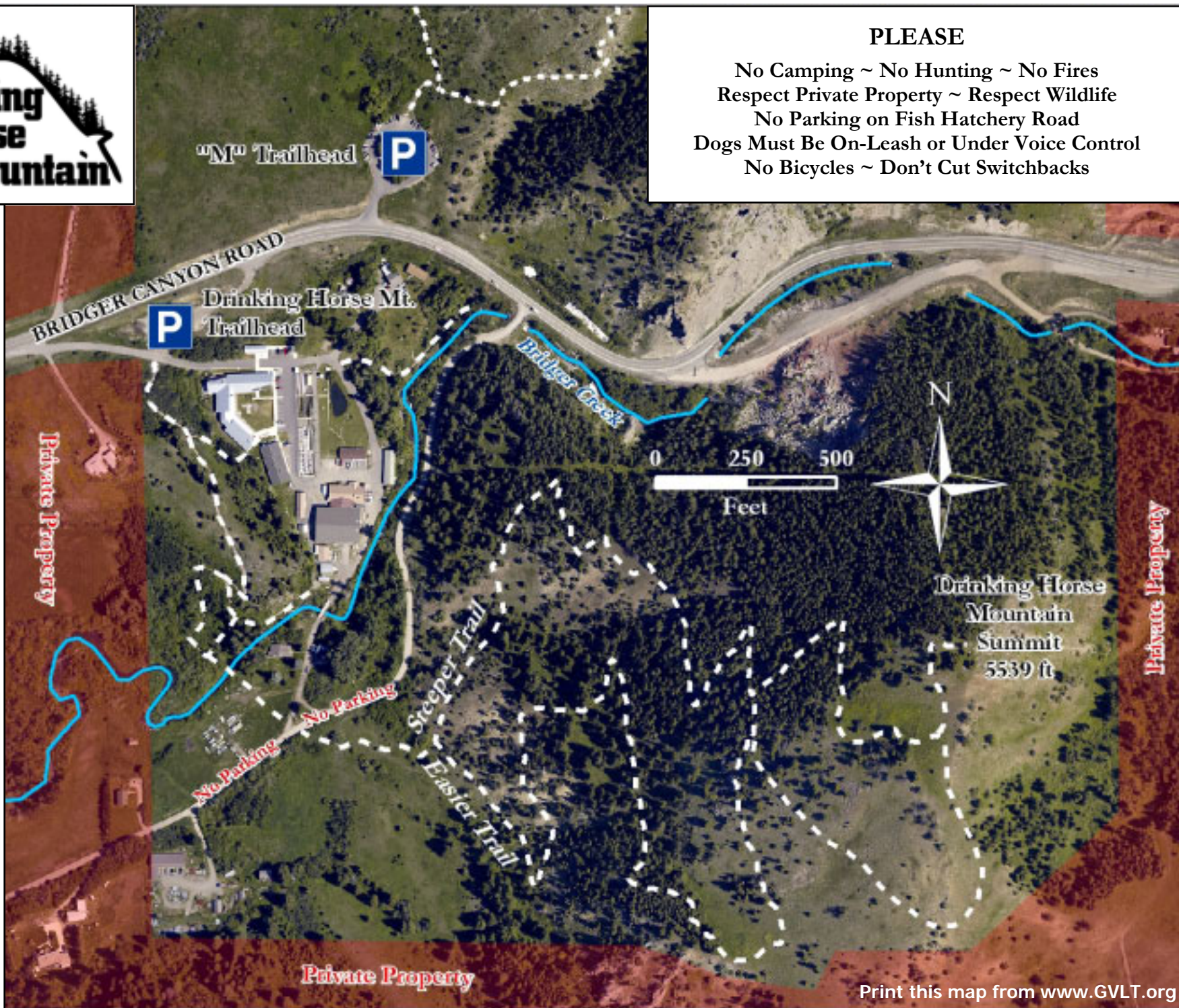

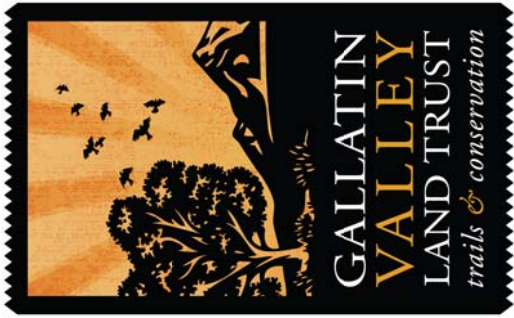

From willows and cottonwoods along Bridger Creek, to rocky outcrops, evergreen forest and wildflower-decorated hillsides, the Drinking Horse Mountain Trail offers great variety in a 2.4 mile round trip from the trailhead. Enjoy Bridger Creek from the Kevin Mundy Memorial Bridge 0.2 miles from the trailhead, then cross Fish Hatchery Road and enjoy views of Bridger Canyon, the Gallatin Valley and the surrounding mountains as you climb 680 vertical feet to the summit. Looking at the mountain's east face from Bridger Canyon Road, you can see the silhouette of a horse bending its head to drink from Bridger Creek.

The 40-acre Drinking Horse Mountain property was donated to the US Fish & Wildlife Service in 2001 by the White family – some of the area's original settlers. Over the following seven years, Gallatin Valley Land Trust worked with the project partners, many generous donors and volunteers to plan, fund and construct the trail. GVLT continues to work with USFWS and Gallatin National Forest to maintain the trail. You can help – keep Drinking Horse Mountain clean, report problems and become a member of GVLT!
