Year Twenty: *in review*



I moved to Bozeman in 1990, the year Chris Boyd and other community leaders set Gallatin Valley Land Trust on a visionary course that has built a legacy of conservation and trails. I have watched GVLТ grow from a small grassroots group to a healthy and vibrant organization with tremendous accomplishments. When I think of why I have chosen to work and live in this beautiful valley for so many years I think of the quality of life and the sense of community that it provides. With an energetic vision that strengthens the fabric of our community and benefits future generations, GVLТ plays a vital role in creating this sense of place.

Reflecting on our work over the past year, I am truly impressed by the extraordinary accomplishments of the GVLТ team. We completed a record number of conservation easements from the Yellowstone River to Hebgen Lake, Bozeman Pass to Amsterdam & Churchill, and a unique project that included permanent public access to the North Cottonwood trailhead on the west side of the Bridgers. Our Community Trails Program worked on a great variety of projects while keeping our primary focus on the Sourdough Canyon/Bozeman Creek trailhead, where two years of complex partnership building, design, permitting and fundraising are producing significant progress on ambitious and greatly-needed improvements.

Our staff did a great job building that support by keeping us connected with old friends while building new relationships and enthusiasm for our work. We had great participation in all our events, and we were also fortunate to have partnerships with four local artists who generously donated portions of their sale proceeds.

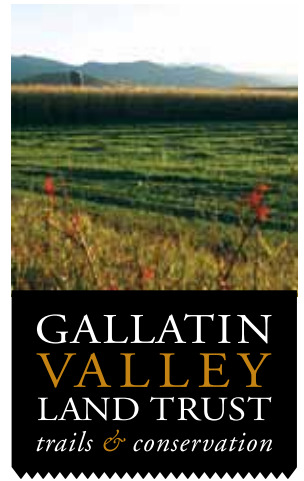

The Bos family farm Conservation Easement

Where Cottonwood Road turns west along the Gallatin foothills, hundreds of acres of open meadow sweep up to forested slopes, while miles of productive farmland stretch north. These are some of the most spectacular scenic agricultural lands making up the cultural and historic fabric of Gallatin Valley, and they are permanently protected thanks to 20 years of GVLТ conservation work. Shortly after GVLТ was founded in 1990, we completed one of our first conservation projects with the Wolny family, protecting over 660 acres of important elk habitat near South Cottonwood. In 2009, we partnered with neighboring families to conserve the Buck-Butterfield farm and the Bos farm, creating over 1,200 acres of contiguous conserved land extending more than 2 miles north from the Gallatin National Forest. Together, these three conservation easements protect prime agricultural soils and critical wildlife habitat in the foothills of the Gallatin Range.

Financial Report: *your support at work*

Fiscal Year 2010 *July 1, 2009 – June 30, 2010*

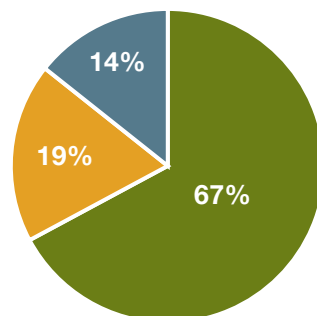
Despite challenging economic conditions across the country, Fiscal Year 2010 was one of GVLТ's most successful in private land conservation and community trails. Thankfully, with prudent fiscal directive of the Board combined with excellent financial oversight by staff, the organization was able to finish the year in the black, although well below our financial goals for the year.

From a programmatic perspective GVLТ accomplished incredible successes in the year, including: completing a record number of easement transactions (13) totaling some 3,900 acres conserved in Gallatin, Park, and Madison counties, completing the Pollinator Garden on the Gallagator trail, receiving National Recreational Trail designation for the Drinking Horse Mountain trail, and securing funding to commence the first phase of Sourdough Canyon trailhead improvements. These projects, along with many others in the pipeline, could not have moved forward without generous support from our partners, countless volunteers, and donors like you.

In terms of our financials, I am happy to report that our assets grew again this year, improving our balance sheet by some \$475,000. Much of this is attributable to changed accounting procedures for grants and stewardship donations along with the appreciation of our investments in the stock market. We also received substantial pledges to our newly created 20th Anniversary Fund commemorating GVLТ's two decades of trails and conservation work in the community. With a goal of \$350,000 the Board has already pledged \$72,000 with our goal to raise the balance in the next two years in order to create an operating reserve sufficient to enhance the financial security of the organization. We invite each and every one of you to consider a special donation to the 20th Anniversary Fund.

Most importantly, we want to thank each of you as generous supporters of the organization. Without you, none of the accomplishments over the last 20 years would have happened. With my tenure as Treasurer coming to close, I feel the organization is well-positioned and staffed to continue the great work that we have all experienced within our community.

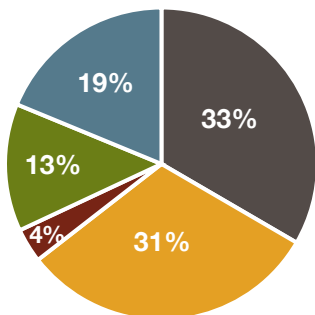

Conservation: *a legacy of open land*

This year was Gallatin Valley Land Trust's most successful in private land conservation in our twenty-year history! Thanks to the vision and generosity of families in Gallatin, Park, and Madison counties, we completed thirteen conservation projects on over 3,900 acres of land.

Waterfront: 2 easements, 1,300 acres



The Yellowstone Ranch Preserve easement conserves 700 acres at Hebgen Lake.

Two special projects in 2010 helped conserve wildlife habitat and agricultural lands adjacent to important water resources in southwest Montana. The Legacy Ranch conserves more than 2.5 miles of Yellowstone River frontage and nearly 600 acres of agricultural land in the spectacular Paradise Valley. The Yellowstone Ranch Preserve conserves over a mile of Hebgen Lake frontage on Horse Butte, and ensures that 700 acres remain open for elk, bison, grizzly and many species of waterfowl.

Gooch Hill: 3 easements, 650 acres

We are honored to have helped three families conserve more than 650 acres of land in the Gooch Hill area this year, including the adjacent Buck-Butterfield Ranch and Bos Farms. Together with one of GVLТ's first conservation easements on the Wolny ranch, over 1,200 acres of contiguous agricultural soils, elk habitat, and scenic lands are conserved, extending more than 2 miles north from the Gallatin National Forest boundary. We also worked with the Owen family to conserve the springs, wetlands, and riparian habitats on their nearby farm.

Public Land Buffer & Access: 2 easement, 415 acres

One of our most unique 2010 projects, the Half Circle Ranch at North Cottonwood Creek has been conserved thanks to the generosity of landowner Harry Armstrong. The easement not only permanently conserves 400 acres of ranchland and mule deer winter range, but also allows

for permanent public access to the North Cottonwood Trail accessing the Gallatin National Forest. We also completed a conservation project with the Van Zandt and Carlson families adjacent to the Beaverhead-Deerlodge National Forest in Madison County, adding 16 acres into their 200-acre 1998 conservation easement.

Amsterdam/Churchill: 4 easements, 1,220 acres

In partnership with the Alberda, Leep, and Kimm families, GVLТ helped conserve more than 1,200 acres of prime agricultural soils in the heart of the Gallatin Valley. These families have over 350 years of combined stewardship on these lands, and each farm is contiguous with other conservation easements. In total, we have helped conserve more than 4,700

Bozeman Pass: 2 easements, 330 acres

Bozeman Pass rests at the heart of the important wildlife movement corridor connecting Yellowstone National Park and the Gallatin Range with the Bridger Mountains. With two new conservation easements donated by the Sorenson and Coker families, GVLТ has now partnered with twelve families to help conserve over 4,000 acres in this spectacular wildlife haven.

Community Trails: *connecting the valley*

When GVLТ was founded in 1990, Bozeman’s trail system totaled just over two miles, including the Gallagator Trail between Church and Kagy and the Sourdough Trail between Fairway and Goldenstein. Created through many years of hard work by Rotary and other visionary community leaders, these two short trail segments inspired GVLТ founder Chris Boyd and many others to envision a much larger trail system. For 20 years, GVLТ has been a leader in turning this vision into reality by building and coordinating broad-based partnerships and volunteer efforts, as demonstrated by our achievements in Fiscal Year 2010.

In addition to the accomplishments highlighted here, we also made significant progress on important projects planned for completion in 2011, including major improvements to the Sourdough Canyon/Bozeman Creek Trailhead; reroutes of flood-prone trails at the East Gallatin Recreation Area; a trail behind the Mall connecting Bozeman Pond to the West Side Trail; and a natural playground at Langohr Park. We are also thrilled to announce the new Chestnut Mountain Trail, constructed by Gallatin National Forest this summer. Just 15 minutes from Downtown Bozeman, this trail is the culmination of a 10-year land conservation and trails project in which GVLТ played an integral role. Though only 300 feet long, this new trail provides an important link to the heart of the Main Street to the Mountains trail system. Using City-owned right-of-way at the College/South Black intersection, it connects the Gallagator Linear Park to College Street—one of the community’s primary east-west connections between the MSU campus and residential and commercial areas.
